Promoting Respect through Start with Hello Week

- Smile Walls
 - Make space in classrooms or around the school to allow students to share notes of kindness, respect and actions that made them smile in school.
- "Hey Day"
 - Everyone wears a name tag so you can address them by name.
- Reach Out Scavanger Hunt
 - Reach out to 5 or more students throughout the week. Exchange a card which has 3 pieces of information about the person.
- Get Caught Saying Hello
 - Throughout the week observe interactions amongst classmates and give small prizes or recognition to students who are "caught" saying hello.
- Mix-N-Mingle
 - Encourage students to sit with someone new at lunch, on the bus and in class. Celebrate connections by designating a space where students can post pictures or write a message about the new student they met.
